ALBANY'S OPPORTUNITY

The Democrat takes its hat off to the town of Puyallup, Washington.

In the year 1902 the enterprising citizens of that community organized the Puyallup Fruit Growers Association for the purpose of establishing a cannery. The company was organized with a limited membership and a capital stock of only \$2,000.00.

On December 31st 1916 this same company issued its annual statement showing the financial condition of the enterprise at the close of business in 1916. Here is a summary of the figures:

Capital stock \$2,717.00
Surplus 113,066.09
Capital and surplus \$115,783.09
Cash on hand Jan. 1, '16 \$40,861.00
Total cash receipts \$1,753,223.07
Total cash disbursements \$1,739,026.18
Cash on hand end of year \$55,058.27

But the above statement does not tell the entire story. In addition to the published financial showing of the association, eighteen hundred growers have become members. This means that eighteen hundred farmers in the vicinity of Puyallup are more or less dependent upon the cannery for their livelihood. It means that eighteen hundred small farms which heretofore remained idle or paid their owners little or no interest have become a source of wealth to the county in which they are located and a direct benefit to the business men living in the city in which the cannery is operating.

All of this was accomplished under the direction and management of W. H. Paulhamus and his success has made his name known to thousands of people in every section of the Pacific northwest. He will be in Albany next Wednesday for the purpose of telling the people of this section of the county how it was done. He ought to have a large crowd.
