FOREIGN MARKETS

The Orient, a few years ago, to the average American was a world set apart by itself, consisting of strange lands, strange people, strange customs struggling against Western ideas. Japan for example, in the minds of the majority of Americans, was associated with cherry blossoms and geisha girls, Fujiyama, and quaint costumes—a picture land of wonders. China would have simply brought up vision of countless people, opium joints, and boxers; while ninety-nine out of one hundred Americans would not have been able, if they are now, to locate the Straits Settlements without the aid of a map; in their minds the Moro stood for the Philippines, and Java, Borneo, and Sumatra had some connection with the "missing link." It is not far out of the way to say that these were the associations connected in the American mind with these nations of the Far East.

But today what a change, what a revolution! Both eyes of the American business man are turned towards the Orient. Trade possibilities which he never dreamed of in years gone by have become realities. The people of these far off lands have arose from their slumbers and unlocked the doors of prejudice against Western ideas and western merchandise. American bankers are beginning to place loans in China. American business firms are sending experts to these lands to study conditions and ascertain the exact situation. American steamship companies are beginning to realize the commercial necessity of operating in Oriental waters, and there is a general re-awakening of interest in the question of promoting American trade and commerce with foreign nations.

The Far East offers a golden harvest and we can't afford to mark time while the crop is being reaped by our commercial rivals.
