JOIN THE NAVY

"The president last night signed an executive order directing that the authorized enlistment strength of the navy be increased to 87,000 men. He was authorized by congress, in case of emergency, to direct such increase in enlistment.

"Will you not emphasize the need by giving prominence Monday on the first page of your paper, to the President's orders, and also by making an editorial appeal for new recruits for the navy?"

The above is in part a telegram received yesterday from Secretary Daniels.

When the Secretary of the Navy sends out a telegram to every daily news paper in America making a plea for the united support of the press in order to fire the patriotism of the country and secure recruits for the United States navy, it goes without saying that the need is urgent. Such a telegram would never have left the files of the department had not the country been standing on the threshold of war. The order would never have been signed had not President Wilson been firmly and irrevocably convinced that a peaceable settlement of our differences with Germany are now impossible. If there has been any doubt in the mind of the American people as to the probability of this country being plunged into the European conflict that doubt has now been removed and we must face the inevitable.

What will be the answer of the young men of America? There can be but one answer consistent with the duty which every citizen owes to his flag and his country and that answer will be made.

There will be men to man the guns on Uncle Sam's ships. There will be men to bear the rifles which are turned out by the government arsenals. It will take time and money to convert them into thorough seamen and good soldiers but the finished product will be able to uphold American rights in any land and upon any sea.

I DIDN'T THINK

In the April Woman's Home Companion Arnold Bennett has an article entitled "The Dull Man is a bad Man" in it he says:

"You may say that the dull man sins by want of thought rather than with intention, uncouthness rather than consciously. Perhaps. But that does not lessen the evil he causes. If I get out of an automobile, and carelessly bang the door of it behind me and catch your finger in the door (you who have remained in the car), and leave it caught there, your agony won't be less acute because I, through not looking behind me either before or after I banged the door, am unaware of it. Nor will your resentment against me be any the less, either.

"Simply to say 'I never realized' is not an entirely satisfactory excuse. People ought to realize. The habit of not realizing grows faster than almost any other habit, and it is very comfortable, and it saves a lot of trouble—to one's self. But it is to be condemned.

"Yet if a man is absolutely dull, if he is utterly without imagination, how can he realize, how can he put himself in the other man's place? Is he got to be pitied instead of anathematized?

"As to that, I will tell you something: There is no such person as the absolutely dull man, the man absolutely without imagination. Everybody has some gift of imagination; everybody can succeed in putting himself, to a certain extent, in the other man's place. And few people, if any, perform this feat as often or as completely as they might do."
