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## RAISING AN ARMY

The problem that the War Depart-  
ment now finds itself confronted with  
is that of "raising a million men be-  
tween sunrise and sunset."

There are no chapters on this particu-  
lar problem in the various books on  
military tactics. It is distinctly an  
American problem which has never  
been solved by an American congress.  
It is the same ghost which haunted  
Lincoln in 1861 and it is now stalking  
in the corridors of the Army and  
Navy building in Washington. More-  
over it will continue to plague the  
minds of future generations of Ameri-  
can military men and prove of no  
small concern to the future of the  
nation if some definite and concrete  
plan of defense is not worked out by  
congress.

There is one, and only one solution  
—the universal military training—  
of the young men of America as pro-  
posed by the Senate Committee on Mil-  
itary Affairs.

Whether the bill is to provide for  
a term of enlistment of six months  
as proposed by Senator Chamber-  
lain, or for a term of one year, as  
proposed by the General Staff, is a  
matter of minor importance. The  
idea is sound. It would provide for  
the future, an army of well drilled  
and efficient men and a reserve corps  
which will be constantly growing in  
numbers. But more than that it pro-  
vides the men without bankrupting  
the government. It gives the young  
men physical training which they re-  
quire and puts them in a position  
where they can be of service to their  
country in the event that they are  
needed.

The present emergency will have to  
be met largely by the old volunteer  
system. We ought to profit by the  
experience of the present and make  
ample provision for the future.

in training with their body.

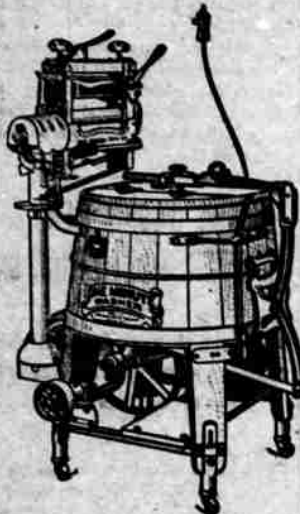
