PEACE WITH HONOR

"There should be just one party
and that should be the American
party. I would be useless on the
battlefield with sightless eyes but
will do my duty with the light
God gave me."
The above statement was made yester-
day on the floor of the House of
Representatives by Congressman
Schall of Minnesota, in his speech
nominating Champ Clark as Speaker
of the House of Representatives.

In these few words the blind con-
gressman from the middle west sum-
med up what should be the attitude of
every patriotic American citizen to-
wards the administration in these
hours of national peril.

We all have our party affiliations
but we have but one flag and but one
country. We all have our individual
views on the tariff, the trusts and the
money question but most of us are
willing to temporarily abandon them
when the war clouds gather and the
nation is on the verge of being plung-
ed into the greatest war in the world's
history.

At the very same hour that the blind
congressman from Minnesota was
pleading for more patriotism and less
partisanship, an army of fifteen hun-
dred pacifists were dispersed from the
Capitol steps by the police.

What a contrast between the two
different viewpoints as to the real
meaning of patriotism.

The fifteen hundred men and women
who were holding the demonstration
were in fact allies of the nations en-
emies. They were misguided to be sure,
but none the less attempting to place
obstacles in the way of a president
who, for three years, has exerted every
effort known to the art of diplomacy
to avert hostilities with Germany.

They offered an olive branch in ex-
change for a throne and demand the
unconditional surrender of American
rights to the Central powers.

Every true American can unite
with these pacifists in a prayer for
peace—but patriotism demands that
it be a peace with honor.
