HITCHCOCK'S SPEECH

There are greater men in the United States senate than Senator Hitchcock of Nebraska, but few of them have better summed up the American viewpoint in relation to the proposed war with Germany than the Senator from that state, in his speech opening the debate on the war resolution reported to the senate by the Committee on Foreign Affairs. In this speech Senator Hitchcock said:

"There should be no faltering, no division and no weakness in the nation. We want no territory, demand no indemnity, have no historic grudges and no antipathies towards the German people. We are going into the war in defense of humanity and to vindicate our racial honor."

Senator Stone replied to Senator Hitchcock's great and patriotic speech with the assertion: "If Congress involves the country in war it will commit the greatest blunder in history." If our reward for our sacrifice in blood and treasure is to be measured by the yardstick of dollars and cents, or by the territorial addition to the country, Senator Stone is right. If it is to be measured by the yardstick of the duty which any great nation owes to humanity then Senator Stone is wrong.

Every avenue of diplomacy has been exhausted in an effort to bring about a settlement in conformity with the law of nations. The president, the cabinet, congress and the country have been patient. Germany has been both begged and threatened. She has declined to listen to either justice or reason. Congress and the country now have but one alternative and that is war.
