A UNITED AMERICA

If Washington despatches are to be believed it is now practically certain that several of the Central and South American countries will join hands with the United States in waging war against the Central Powers.

Cuba has already taken the necessary steps to place her among the ranks of the allies and Panama has proclaimed her loyalty to the United States in the present conflict. The relations between Germany and Brazil were strained to the breaking point by the recent sinking of the Brazilian steamer "Parana" and the entrance of that country into the war is regarded as morally certain. Guatemala is also seriously contemplating a break in diplomatic relations with Germany and other South and Central American nations make no secret of their sympathy with the United States in her fight against Germany.

To our mind it is fitting and proper that the nations of all America stand together in upholding the law of nations against any European aggressor.

South and Central America can thank the United States and the "Monroe Doctrine" for their very existence as nations. We have stood by, in the role of the powerful big brother and served formal notice upon the crowned heads of Europe that South America must settle her political questions without the aid or assistance of any nation of the old world. We have served without pay as an international policeman and it is gratifying to find that our plea for united action upon the part of the nations of the new world is meeting with such a generous response.
