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TRAIL OF THE SUBMARINE.
It Always Betrays Its Presence to the Keen Eyed Watcher.
A submarine always reveals her presence to the seeing eye. If near the surface, her periscope leaves the betraying wake, and even when she is 100 feet or more under water she always disturbs the surface in a way that, to the experienced observer, makes her presence known. The watcher in an airplane quickly sees such disturbances, even if the submarine is too far under the sea to be seen itself. But the important fact is that the submarine spends most of her time on the surface. One famous submarine's ability to sail seventy miles under water without rising is regarded as a great achievement. Most submarines, that is, cannot keep submerged nearly so long. The reason is that it has to come to the surface to recharge its electric batteries. This recharging is done by the oil engines, which can work only on the surface because of the exhaust. In addition to its other disadvantages this recharging process makes a noise that can be heard five miles away. While undergoing this ordeal the submarine is in a helpless condition, and a well aimed shot even from a small gun, such as a motorboat can carry, can pierce its thin steel plates and send it to the bottom.—World's Work.
