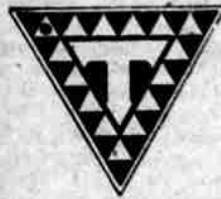

### Law of the Scarlet "A"

Here is the old New England law under which Hester Prynne, heroine of "The Scarlet Letter," which has been made into a wonderful drama by William Fox, was doomed to wear the scarlet "A." It was enacted in Plymouth in 1658.

"It is enacted by the Court and the Authorities thereof that whosoever shall commit Adultery shall be severely whipped two or several times viz: once while the Court is in being at which they are convicted of the fact, and the second time as the Court shall order, and likewise to wear two Capital letters viz: A. D. cut in cloth and sewed on their uppermost garments on their arms or back; and if at any time they shall be taken without said letters, while they are in the Government soe worse, to be forthwith Taken and publicly whipt."
