SCIO MAN PLANS TO REDUCE HIGH FOOD COSTS

Will Agree to Limit Price and
Sell to Consumer; Other
Scio News Items.

Scio, Ore., April 26.—If the plan advocated by Riley Shelton, a leading citizen of Scio, is adopted, and put into effect the high cost of living will be greatly lowered with regards to food supplies. This citizen has thrown down the challenge to his fellow producers to help in lowering the cost of farm and dairy products. He has offered to sign a contract to the effect that every bushel of potatoes, onions, beans, and grain grown for sale in this vicinity shall be sold at a reasonable rate of profit to be fixed by a committee selected by the growers pooling their interests.

Above such fixed price a member of the pool would not be allowed to accept or even entertain an offer. It is further stipulated that the food is to be sold directly to the consumer, thus doing away with the middle man who is so dangerous to the stability of food prices.

The Scio schools are planning a festive day for May 5. In conjunction with Jefferson, Riverside and other nearby schools a May Day exercise of May Pole Pageant, crowning of the May Queen and a general good time has been planned.

A track meet has been arranged for the same day in which representatives from the various schools will take part. There will be base ball games between boys' teams and between girls' teams, tennis tournaments, croquet games and other sports. A big feed will take place at noon.

In connection with the May Day exercises the people of Scio also ex-

pect to have a flag raising event, and the stars and stripes will be hauled to the top of a lofty flag pole. Addresses will be delivered by capable orators and the Scio band will furnish music.

Fifteen Scio high school boys and girls have already joined the garden and food conservation corps and vacant lots are being captured and taken in charge of for the purpose of

enlarging the national output of vegetables for fall use.
