New Allsteel Safe Ideal Filing Cabinet

C. G. Rawlings, Albany's well-known printer, stationer and office supply dealer, has just received one of the new Underwriters' model Allsteel safes made by the General Fireproofing Co., of Youngstown, Ohio. The business man or farmer or anyone interested in keeping his records and valuables in an absolutely fire proof safe, which is also a nearly burglar proof as such things usually are, will be interested in this durable, serviceable, neat-looking contrivance.

The most important feature of the safe is the fire retardent insulation used in it. By use of good steel plates, a specially prepared composition used between the walls, and the dead air chambers, combine to make it absolutely fire resistable. Mr. Rawlings has pictures showing views of terrible fires through which these safes have gone and preserved their contents perfectly.

The safe was tested by the National Board of Fire Underwriters and came up in every way to their requirements. This is why it is called the "Underwriters' Model."

While safety for office records is the primary purpose of all safes, there are other features which should be considered as well. The comparative light weight of the Allsteel safe makes it possible to get more than four times the filing space that the old solid steel safes gave.

And the interior arrangement can be made to fit any business. Standard U-Nette and Wydesteel Sections, roller shelves, plain shelves, pigeon hole arrangements, letter and card filing drawers, or any arrangement or combination can be fitted in and changed with very little trouble.

The doors swing easily on heavy hinges and heavy drop handles operate at the slightest turn, locking 12 easy sliding bolts. A three-tumbler Yale combination lock puts the seal on the bolts.

The safes are made in various sizes to conform to the requirements of the business and the sizes of the office to which they are to be fitted. They are enameled in three finishes, green, oak and mahogany. In this day every office should be equipped with the most modern fixtures, not only for the safety of the records and correspondence, which should be preserved, but for the time and labor-saving advantages as well.

Mr. Rawlings is very proud of his latest device, which he has installed in his own office, and also expects to place a large number of them in Albany and other Linn county offices.
