**"BOBBY" HARRON STAR
OF "THE BAD BOY"**

"The Bad Boy," a comedy drama of Young America, will be shown at the Globe Theatre tonight. This is the first play to present Robert Harron on the Triangle program as an individual star.

Setting down among juniper trees on both banks of the fast flowing Deschutes, a unique city of six thousand, according to a recent private census, is Bend, a transformed city, attracting much attention. Saw mills and flour mills employing, it is said, 1600 men, with a pay roll of \$90,000, or more, a month, is what has done it.

Bustling, busy Bend.

The city probably has the most unique hotel in the country, built by Philip R. Brooks of Vancouver, B. C. Part logs, part lava rock, modern in all the details, it is a marvel. Worth a long trip to see. Even the front door is odd, a rough board affair. The office lobby, a long one, has a leopard effect, with an enormous lava rock fire place, decorated with a stuffed wild cat and Chinese pheasants, and the general decorations have a wild effect. In the dining room is an immense plate glass window, called the picture window, because thru it Nature presents a scene worth while. The rooms above are simply neat and modern.

A pleasant spot in my Bend visit was a fine dinner at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Dave Keller, former Albany people, with their three boys and two girls. Mr. Keller is joint agent for the two railroads and two express companies ending here, a decidedly busy man.

Bend is the center and distributing point for an immense trade reaching far interior. The shipments from here average about 40 carloads daily, lumber, stock, etc.

Henry Fowler, a former Albany Democrat city editor, is now on the Daily Bulletin.

Harvey Davis has an eating house labeled Eats, and reports a good business.

S. C. Caldwell, a former Albany plumber, is mayor of the town and now looks after a suburban farm.

Frank Elkins is employed at the depot freight warehouse. Elkins' addition to Albany was named after his father.

Prof. Thordarson, formerly of Lebanon, is superintendent of schools and Prof. Bolt, from the same place, high school principal, giving the people a splendid school.
