Mrs. A. C. Schmitt, who has been suffering with a bad case of blood poisoning, is improving and will soon

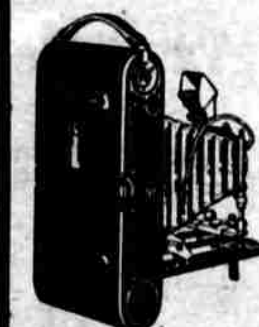
