WESTERN STATES READY FOR \$15,000,000 DRIVE

Red Cross Ready to Do Share
On Western Coast Next
Week

San Francisco, Cal., June 14.—The strenuous "drive" to raise the fifteen million dollars, asked of the States west of the Mississippi by the National Red Cross in its effort to raise a hundred million during Red Cross Week (June 18 to 25) has been successfully organized through the tireless efforts of the committee which has just finished its tour of the five districts in the Western territory.

Meetings were held in San Francisco for the California district north of Bakersfield and for Nevada; in Los Angeles, for the California district south of Bakersfield, as well as for Arizona and Western Texas; in Portland for Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Montana; in Denver for Colorado, New Mexico, Wyoming, North Dakota, South Dakota, Utah, Iowa, and Nebraska, and in Wichita, for Kansas, East Texas, Arkansas, Missouri and Oklahoma.

In every city where these meetings were held, the response to the call was remarkable for the promptness of the answer to the appeal and for the enthusiasm manifested. The most important men in the community have attended the conferences and tendered their personal services as well as promised substantial contributions. A carefully organized canvass of each community has been prepared; team captains have been selected from the strongest men available, and the details of the campaign have been worked out on the same lines which have proved so successful in those cities where Y. M. C. A. campaigns for buildings and other endowments have been conducted.

In each city and district the canvass will be as thorough as organization and enthusiasm can make it. No possible source of money will be overlooked, and no method of arousing interest in the undertaking will be slighted. Billboards, street car advertising signs, posters, striking and artistic, circulars, stamped envelopes and slips in mail will all be urged in bringing to the attention of all the people the urgent need for raising the big sum which has been asked for military and civilian relief at this initial stage of the war.

U. S. MARINES LEARN FRENCH VERY READILY

Washington, June 14.—"Ray-vay-mwah kong ler dee-nay ser-ah pray," is the proper way to tell a Frenchman to wake you up when dinner is ready, according to a little "French in one lesson," that has been distributed among the United States Marines who are going to France.

Every sea soldier on the firing line will be supplied with a handy little pocket dictionary that contains about a thousand practical words and phrases, together with the phonetic pronunciation, according to Hannibal, Charlemagne, or whoever it was that originated the French language. It is just the size to fit handily into the breast pocket of a uniform.

Doubtless the little poem will lend a hand to his American comrade when he comes to a particularly knotty problem. Should the sea-soldier become peeved at the intricacies of the language, he may say, "Ock-oopay"—just like that. It means "busy."
