THE RED CROSS

Commandeering an entire nation! That's what is meant in the present campaign of the Red Cross War Council to raise a hundred million Fund during the Red Cross Week. The President has issued his call. He has made formal proclamation, setting aside these days from June 18 to 25 for the specific purpose of gathering into the Red Cross treasury this immense sum of money for military and civil relief during the United States' present struggle with Germany. This is the period of sweeping enthusiasms. Ten million young men responded to their country's call and gave their lives. Millions of women gave their men. The purses of the nation have been hadly emptied to finance the contest with Germany. Now comes the appeal to the nation to finance the succor of the wounded and their dependents. The slogan is "Don't send your boy or your neighbor's boy across the water without having him know that, wounded or sick, he will be properly cared for." The appeal is direct, and it penetrates to every home, where eligible young men are waiting for the draft. It is more than an appeal, as witness the promptness with which the big business men of the country have laid aside their important affairs and devoted all their time and labor to organizing and directing the canvas for the Hundred Million. The President commandeered them, and they obeyed. The people of the entire nation are commandeered to provide for their own wounded, soon to fall on the battlefronts. Just as the big business men have answered the call, so, the Red Cross War Council expects the rank and file of the nation's citizenship will rally to this new summons and oversubscribe the sum asked for.
