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BUSINESS MATTER.
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A MISTAKEN IDEA

The Cologne Gazette, regarded as a semi-official organ of the German government, recently printed a remarkable article regarding American political conditions, in the course of which it says that Lord Northcliffe has come here to combat the German propaganda, and pays its respect to our German citizens as follows:
"Ours best allies will continue to be, as hitherto, German-Americans. Their services to the German cause can only be underestimated by people grossly ignorant of American conditions."

"As good Americans our compatriots have hitherto not pursued a policy of political separation. They therefore do not constitute any national group of their own in the political life of the Nation, which is not a constellation of nationalities. Their direct influence, on the other hand, is all the greater, inasmuch as all classes, professions, political circles and other sections of American society are permeated to the highest degree with German-Americans. They inject into American public opinion an element of restraint and circumspection which already has often been the cause of embarrassment to Herr Wilson and his English friends. We may be certain that at this moment also they are at their posts."

This is intended as praise of our German-Americans, based evidently on the assumption that they are better Germans than Americans. We do not see how it can be received otherwise than with keen resentment by the great mass of our Germanic citizens. And the writer plainly has the "wrong dope" as usual.
There has indeed been a disquieting amount of thinly veiled pro-German activity in this country, operating under various disguises, since war was declared; but it has evidently been the work of comparatively few men, some of them aliens. The absence of any such general German-American fight against our full participation in the war as the Cologne newspaper assumes is seen in the tremendous success of the Liberty Loan and in the rapid maturing of all our big war plans.

GOVERNMENT WANTS CLERKS

The United States Civil Service Commission announces that as a sufficient number of male and female stenographers will not be secured from the examination to be held June 30, 1917, to meet the needs of the public service, an examination has been announced to be held at forty of the principal cities in the Northwest on July 7th.

Men typewriters without a knowledge of stenography are desired especially in connection with the Quartermaster Corps, United States army, at an entrance salary of \$1000 per year. A majority of the clerks in the Quartermaster Corps, U. S. army, are being selected from the typewriter register, and all male typewriters who can qualify are urged to apply for the examination July 7th.

Arrangements will be made by the District Secretary to examine all persons who write to him, subject to the subsequent filing and approval of applications, provided the request is received at Seattle in sufficient time to arrange for examination at the place nearest to the applicant's residence where the examination will be held.
