THE WAR REFERENDUM

Not long ago a few vociferous Americans who thought they represented public opinion were demanding a "war referendum." They wanted the nation to vote on the question of entering the war before Congress took any irrevocable step. A little later, when that issue had been settled by the declaration of war with the evident approval of the country, they demanded a referendum on the selective draft. There, too, they lost; and the way in which the nation marched to the polls to register its eligible manhood was a revelation.

Then there came a real referendum, as definite and decisive as the citizens in question could have desired. The Liberty Loan constituted an admirable test of public sentiment regarding the government's war policy. It was put forward as a popular loan, not a banker's loan. The appeal was to the people—to the average man and woman of the nation.

The Liberty Loan referendum vote speaks for itself. It isn't that the loan was greatly oversubscribed; the important point is the number of people who subscribed. While optimists hoped that subscribers might total 1,000,000, they swelled to an army of 3,000,000. More than ten times as many Americans subscribed as had ever bought government bonds before. They surpassed the records of similar loans in every other belligerent country.

Now the obstructionists are silenced.
