ALFONSO FOR PRESIDENT

One of the stories coming out of the political confusion of Spain within the last week is to the effect that King Alfonso is willing to yield to the establishment of a republican form of government, and would like to become the first president.

This looks, on the face of it, very much like a joke. Alfonso is a Bourbon, one of the few remaining scions of the oldest and proudest royal houses in Europe.

The present ferment in Spain is unintelligible to most outsiders. It seems uncertain whether Spain will swing to the German side or to the side of the Allies, or neither, and whether she will remain a monarchy or follow her neighbor, Portugal's example, and turn republican.

DUELING POPULAR IN ARGENTINE

Buenos Aires, June 10.—(by Mail)—(U. P.)—Items like the following, which appeared in the Buenos Aires Herald recently, are seen frequently in the Argentine press:
'In the 'quinta' (dooryard) of Dr. Delcasse, a prominent lawyer, situated in Belgrano (a Buenos Aires suburb), a duel with sabres was fought yesterday between Senores Manuel Rocca and Ezequiel B. Casbas before several witnesses.
