My son, aged 24, unmarried, was graduated as an aviator from the Curtiss school in Hammondsport, in July, 1914. He offered his services to our government just about a month ago. He cannot be accepted because he has not a college education—"A Mother" in the Tribune.

One of the many things our "war lords" at Washington should learn from British experience—should be before this have learned—is the need of the prompt abandonment of a lot of foolish restrictions the only effect of which is to deprive the nation of the services of capable men. The provisions that a man must have had four years in college before he can be taken into the aviation service is a "freak." At the outbreak of the war Great Britain had some such requirement but when experience brought knowledge it was promptly abandoned.
