AIR SUPREMACY

It is now accepted without question that the United States, no matter what else we do in her war, must have supremacy in the air, and thereby give supremacy to the allied powers.

The game is primarily to "blind the enemy's eyes" by driving his own planes, balloons and dirigibles from the air. If he cannot see what we are doing on our side of the battle line, he cannot attack us.

Another fact, which has not yet received the attention that it deserves, is the usefulness of aircraft in combating the submarine peril.

At present, allied air supremacy is restricted by the need of holding thousands of airplanes in England to repel German air raids.

Our government is planning now to build 22,000 fighting planes and train 100,000 aviators. A bill before Congress calls for an appropriation of \$369,000,000 for that purpose.

We can accomplish more in the air, for the same expenditure of money and men, than in any other way. By all means let us have overwhelming aerial supremacy by land and sea, and have it quickly.

A WONDERFUL SEARCHLIGHT.

The Most Powerful in the World. It Almost Rivals the Sun.

It is ten feet high, its mirror has a diameter of five feet, and it weighs three tons. Its beam is as brilliant as the sun at 8 o'clock in the morning or 4 in the afternoon, New York latitude, and you can read a newspaper by its light thirty miles away.

These are a few astonishing facts in the Popular Science Monthly about the Sperry searchlight, the invention of Elmer A. Sperry of Brooklyn, who is already known as the inventor of the airplane stabilizer and ship gyrocompass bearing his name and the first electric arc light.

One of the most powerful beacons along the coast is the Sandy Hook lighthouse. But the Sperry searchlight is twenty-two times more brilliant than that light. Were the Sperry lamp substituted for the lighthouse beacon a ship passing out to sea could be bathed in light until it disappeared below the horizon. By swinging the light back and forth across the sky it has been made visible 120 miles away. For navy use the Sperry lamp illuminates a target ten times more brilliantly than any other projector devised.
