T. J. Anderson, postmaster of Harrisburg, is in Albany today on business. He was a former assessor of Linn county.

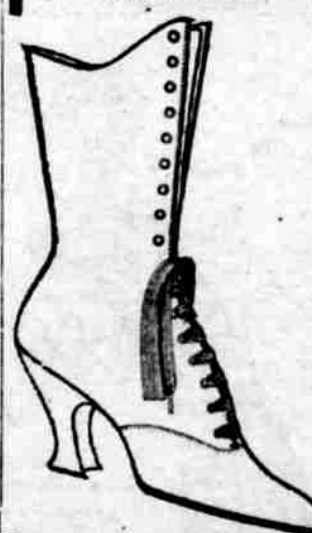
