WAR MOVIES

The Council of National Defense has been receiving many petitions asking that the showing of war films be forbidden in the movie houses. The reason generally given is that these films, by their graphic description of the horrors of modern warfare, have been deterring young men from enlisting and putting fear into the minds of the registered men and their families. At their best, the critics say, the films present only one phase, and that the most obnoxious phase, of the struggle.

If it is true that our moving picture theatres in general are giving only the revolting side of the war, certainly something ought to be done about it. This is a legitimate subject for the federal government to busy itself with. The movie stage has become such a power in the shaping of public sentiment that it must not be permitted to give false, distorted impressions regarding so vital a thing as the war we are engaged in. Better no war films at all than films that tell half-truths.

But the evil can be corrected without so drastic a step as absolute prohibition. It is not necessary to suppress the worst aspect of the war. It is only necessary to supplement it with the best side. What the American people want, at movie shows as well as in their newspapers, is the whole truth, good and bad together. Along with the pictures of fierce struggle, terrified bombardment, toil, privation and pain let us have pictures of patient endurance, of heroic achievement, of victory, of cheerful and successful effort at the front and at home, in the factories and in the training camps. Let the films present the noble idealism of the war, the human virtues it calls into play and the fine sentiment it engenders, no less than the dark passions and horrors.

Such presentation would give us all proper mental preparation for our big task.

Raw Eggs Keep Longer Than Boiled.
Raw eggs keep good much longer than cooked eggs, even when these are hard boiled. This was proved by Dr. Leon Lindet, a member of the Paris Conseil d'Hygiene, after many French soldiers had reported that the hard boiled eggs they received from home had gone bad, while the raw eggs remained edible for weeks.
Dr. Lindet explains this fact by saying that the boiling makes the inner membrane pervious to gases, liquids and microbes, and the white of the egg becomes an agglomeration of coagulated albumen and particles of a serum that is an ideal medium in which microbes thrive.

Wild Carrot Seed.
Seeds of the wild carrot are small but very numerous and are covered with weak bristles which catch on wool, hair and clothing and distribute the weed for considerable distances. They frequently are harvested with grass, clover and alfalfa seed and are widely distributed by this means. As found in clover seed, the wild carrot seeds are usually without bars, as these are rubbed off in the clover huller.

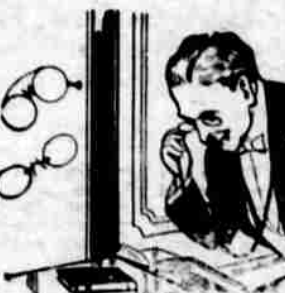

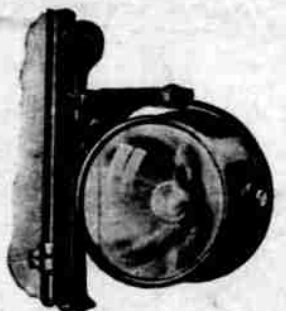
