DRAFTED MEN MUST VOL- UNTEER BEFORE NOTICE

It has been officially announced by the War Department that after a registered person has been chosen for military service, and has received official notice from the local board to appear for physical examination, he ceases to be eligible for voluntary enlistment. This means that up to the time mentioned above any one who has been selected for military duty, may, if he chooses to do so, enlist in either the Regular Army, the Navy, or any one of the State Military organizations that may not have its full quota.

Postmaster Stewart, the local enlisting officer, informs us that in the Navy at the present time the only ratings that are open for recruits are as follows:

Apprentice seamen, from 18 to 25 years old.

Firemen, all classes, from 21 to 35 year old.

Machinists' mates, all classes, from 21 to 25 years old.

Musicians, from 18 to 25 years.

Ship's Cooks, landsmen and 4th class, 18 to 25 years, and all previous service men who have been discharged and are entitled to re-enlistment.

In the Regular Army at present

only applicants for the Infantry, Field Artillery, and the Medical Department can be accepted. In this branch of the service the enlistment is only for the period of the war.
