London, Aug. 11.—Arthur Henderson, minister without a portfolio and labor member of the war council, resigned it is officially announced. His resignation was accepted.

Henderson was criticised since he conferred with French Socialists regarding participating in the Stockholm conference. He defended his action saying that he met with the French Socialists as the leader of the labor party and not as an official of Great Britain.
