NO TROOPS TO RUSSIA

The public is in hearty agreement with the Root mission in its opposition to sending soldiers to Russia. It is difficult to believe that any important official of our government could plan.

We sympathize deeply with Russia in her troubles. We admire the ardent spirit of democracy the nation has shown. We want to become better acquainted with that great people. We want them to win the war.

The Russian republic doesn't need our men. It has more man-power of its own than it can handle. What it needs from America is moral and industrial support.

Confidence in Russia's integrity and ability to work out her problems—the sort of confidence that Mr. Root professes after a thorough review of the situation—will do much to help the young giant get on his feet and fight victoriously.

As for fighting men, France is the place for them. Our expeditionary troops would be lost among the Russian hordes.

There is practically no grass in the pastures and farmers are feeding their stock with hay and silage until the fields are ready to pasture. Fruit will be scarce and small, berries were quite plenty but the extremely hot weather caused them to dry up before they are ripened.
