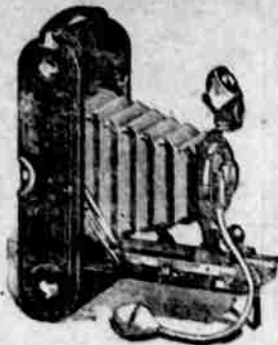

Stories from the Bible, as well as stories of heroism, are charmingly told by Mrs. Lyon at the evening hour.

During the ten-day period the boys are taken on numerous hikes to the nearby hills, and each group greets the sunrise from Peterson's Butte. Camping near the Summit and making the ascent in time to see the first rays of the Eastern light is an experience of each group.

Always as ever Mr. and Mrs. Lyon seek to instill the cardinal principles of truth and kindness in the minds of the boys, and who tell the far-reaching effect of their labor of love?

May the Big Brother Farm be able to extend its influence as the years go by is the wish of all who have been brought in touch with the work being done by Mr. and Mrs. Lyon.—Express (Lebanon).
