#### LITTLE "SLACKING"

A thorough investigation conducted in New York City by the Federal department of justice in collaboration with state authorities results in the announcement that no more than 2 per cent of men of selective service Saw Big Gameage failed to register. The small number of delinquents is gratifying. Still more so is the statement of the deputy state attorney that even in the case of the 2 per cent, there was little evidence of intentional "slacking."

"The dodgers," he says, "are mostly lodging house rounders," a shiftless and decadent type of humanity found in every city, of whom nothing much in the way of public or private service is ever expected. "Otherwise almost all of the men who have failed to appear before the local boards can be accounted for on other grounds than wilful evasion. We have found that many of the missing men have enlisted in the army or navy. Some were in the hospitals at the time set for examination. A few are in prison. There was no general evasion of the draft."

If this is the case in the metropolis with its varied population, its enor mous proportion of aliens and all the human flotsam and jetsam that ac sumulates in a great city, the average proportion of dodgers in the res of the country must be still small
