to reside in. They impress one very much like the larger cities in the Willamette Valley, possibly a little bit more progressive.

As the Columbia Highway was temporarily closed, we were compelled to ship our car by boat from Portland to The Dalles, and from there we motored to Wasco, and from Wasco through Moro and Grass Valley to Shaniko. The soil around Wasco, Moro and Grass Valley is black, and the general condition of the country reminded one very much of the Iowa and Illinois Prairies, except that the country is a little more rolling. This is considered a fine wheat growing section, but on account of the long dry season the crops were not good this year. The people are quite prosperous in these communities, and the communities have a substantial appearance which is not unlike that of the towns in the Willamette Valley. The banker at Moro told us that land around there was selling at \$75 an acre, and everything indicated that the farmers are quite prosperous. The altitude at Shaniko is considerably higher than that of the other towns mentioned, and the country is quite barren. It is not for the grain warehouses at Shaniko, and for the fact that it is the railroad terminal. Shaniko would be hardly worth while considering. The country about Shaniko is quite rugged, there are steep gulches and high cliffs, and the chances are that Shaniko never will come to much of a city. It appeared to us as one of the most forsaken and undesirable localities that we visited.

It was our impression before visiting Eastern Oregon that Eastern Oregon was a large flat prairie country covered with sage brush, but our idea was decidedly wrong in this respect. Eastern Oregon has mountains, hills and valleys such as the Willamette Valley has not. It reminds one very much of the mountainous section of Colorado.

On our trip from Shaniko to Madras we passed through several fertile valleys where alfalfa was grown extensively by means of irrigation. These alfalfa ranches would look good to even an Illinois prairie farmer. Madras gives one the impression of a new community. It is not a very large town, but the people are optimistic. From Madras we drove over to Prineville. Prineville is one of the oldest towns in Central Oregon. It has an air of substantiality about it such as none of the Eastern Oregon towns seem to have. About Prineville there are a number of very fertile valleys, and alfalfa is grown in abundance; also considerable stock raising is carried on there. Prineville has two banks, and a good hotel, and is quite a good sized town. At present there is under construction a railway
