GENERAL SOUTH HEADS BRITISH REPRISAL BOARD

LONDON, Oct. 5.—(U. P.)—General South will probably direct the reprisal raids over German cities. The war cabinet decided to retaliate for the London air raids.
Plans are being made for a department of retaliation, organized solely for German raids. The department will be independent of other aerial services. The aircraft production was ordered increased.

HIGH SCHOOL BIBLE CLASS GIVEN QUESTIONS

Dr. W. P. White's Bible classes in the high school are attracting considerable interest and attention. In the senior and junior high schools between 85 and 90 pupils are enrolled and great interest is taken by the members of the classes.
The course is conducted under the plans laid down by the state school superintendent, Supt. Churchill, in the preface of the course of study, states that "a knowledge of the Bible is an essential element in a good education, and though one may not be interested in it as a manual of devotion, he should be familiar with it as literature and history."
The course is made interesting from the historic standpoint.
Every week Dr. White will submit a list of questions. The first list, on the book of Genesis, is as follows:

1. Make a list of the "beginnings" of Genesis.
2. Give a brief sketch of the course of human history as recorded in Genesis.
3. What was the moral condition of Adam and Eve before the Fall?
4. What sin did they commit?
5. At whose instigation?
6. What was the result?
7. Tell the story of Cain and Abel.
8. Why was Cain's sacrifice rejected and Abel's accepted?
9. Give from memory a list of the important persons mentioned in Genesis, with a brief account of the life of each.
10. What was the moral condition of the earth immediately before the flood?
11. Tell briefly the story of the flood.
12. What covenant did God make with Noah?
13. Name Noah's sons.
14. Tell the story of the Tower of Babel and the Confusion of Tongues.
15. What covenant did God make with Abraham? Was it conditional?
16. Tell the story of Abraham and Lot.
17. Tell the story of Sarai and Hagar.
18. Tell the story of the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah.
19. Give an account of the sacrifice of Isaac.
20. Tell the story of Isaac and Rebekah. Gen. chapters 24, 18, 29.
21. Tell the story of Jacob and Esau.
22. Tell the story of Jacob and the Angel.
23. Tell the story of the early life of Joseph.
24. Tell the story of Joseph's hardships and triumph in Egypt.
25. Tell the story of Israel in Egypt.
