On Business Trip—

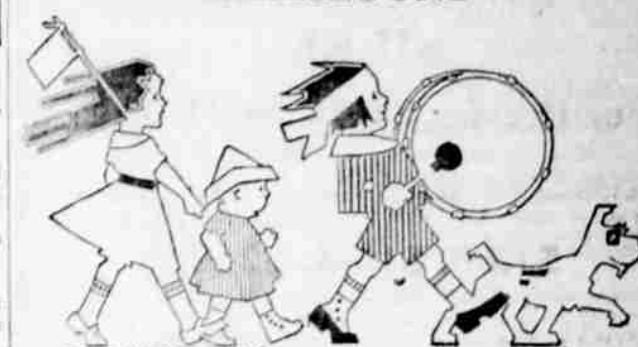
