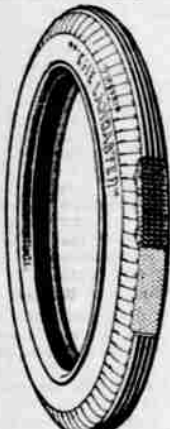

Cavort at Globe Tonight

Douglas Fairbanks, star of "Wild and Woolly," the Arctura picture now being shown at the Globe theatre, has the wanderlust of a school-boy. About three months ago he deserted his studio and, accompanied by a packmule, tramped to Hallett's Peak. Recrossing the Great Divide, he then made his way into Medicine Bow Range in Wyoming. When the production of "Wild and Woolly" was planned Douglas' vivid description of this trip prompted Director Emerson to use several of these scenes for his exteriors and as a result, practically the same territory was revisited by the popular actor-producer, much to his delight.
