

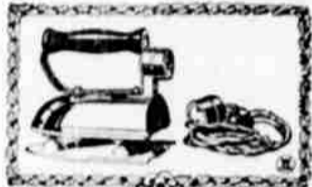

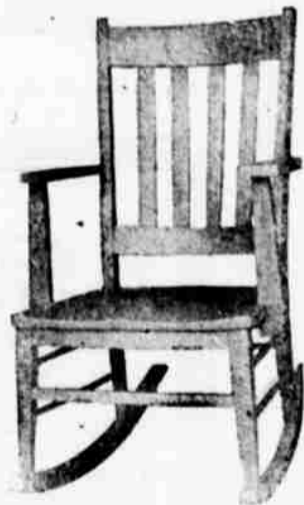

##### RUSSIAN EDITOR WRITES OF EFFECT OF NEW FREEDOM

##### Kerensky Doomed Last Summer, He Declares

##### FLOUR, MEAT ARE HIGH

##### Newspapers Spring Up Everywhere; People Awake After Long Lethargy

PORTLAND, Dec. 13.—(U. P.)—Freedom is a new and wonderful thing to the Russians—and it's having a strange effect upon them.

The Russians have an all-consuming interest in public affairs, declares John S. Schlenning in a letter written his brother Alexander Schlenning, here. John Schlenning is editor of a the People's Paper in Saratoff, on the Volga.

Newspapers have sprung up everywhere throughout Russia, the letter declares. The Russians, formerly a sleepy race, now are interested in everything, the editor writes. The average peasant will drive 100 miles across a frozen plain to hear the situation discussed.

The reaction against the old regime is extreme. Everything that hints of the days of the monarchy meets public disapproval.

Schlenning declared a strong undercurrent against the Kerensky government existed the middle of last summer and Kerensky then was doomed to be overthrown.

Wheat flour costs from \$10 to \$15 for 40 pounds in Russia and meat prices range from 70 to 80 cents.

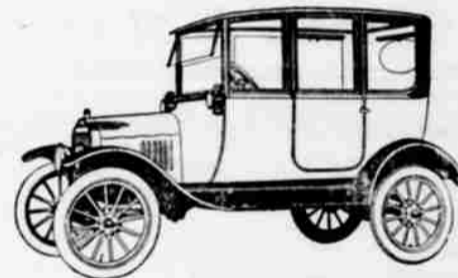
