**Records for Boys—**

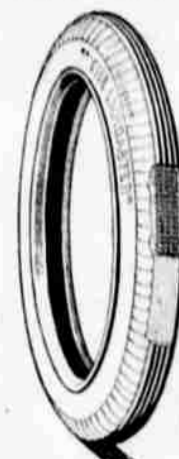

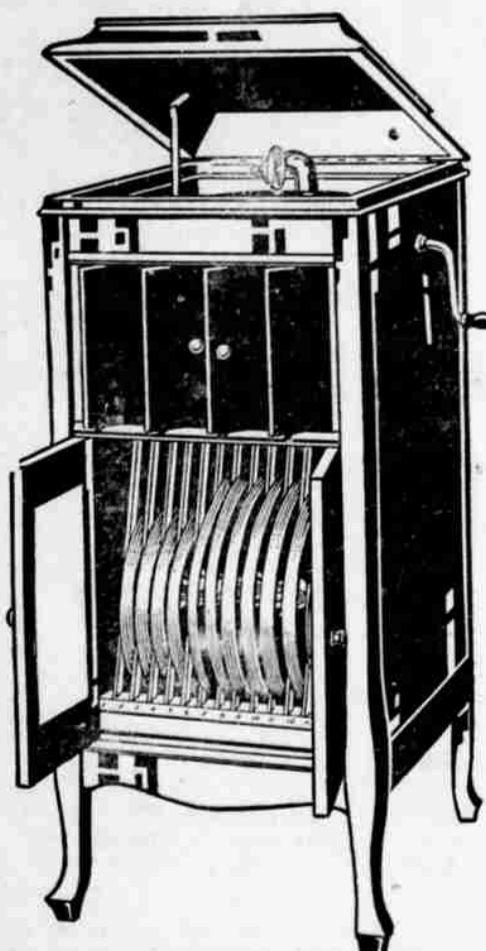
