BIG PAINTING COMES TO LIFE IN SCREEN PLAY

One of the most impressive scenes ever reproduced on the screen is the visualization of Hoffman's wonderful painting, "Mary Magdalene Before Christ," which will be shown in the Metro wonderplay starring Ethel Barrymore, "The Lifted Veil," which will be seen at the Rolfe Theatre on Sunday.

The picture is first seen as a stained glass window in the church where the heroine, played by Miss Barrymore, is worshipping. Impressed by the powerful sermon and the sight of the sun breaking through the stained glass picture, the picture itself seems to assume life in her mind's eye.

The figures of the painting are seen to move and the whole impressive scene, when the mob drags Mary Magdalene before Christ, is acted before the spectator up to the moment when Christ shames the woman's captors with the words: "Let him that is without sin among you cast the first stone."

Gradually the mob is seen to sink away, leaving the two principal figures together and then these dissolve again into the stained glass window.

The experience has a profound effect on the life and thoughts of Clarinda Gildersleeve, the heroine. Incidentally, the scene furnishes an opportunity for remarkable photography.

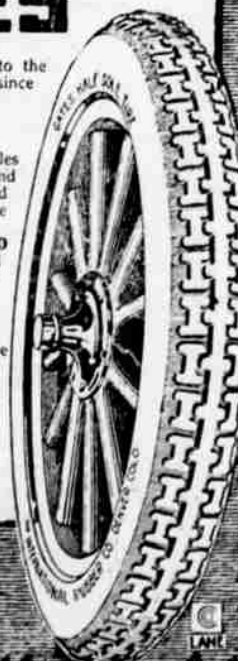
