## PROF. LEWIS GIVES ADVISE IN PRUNE PLANTING

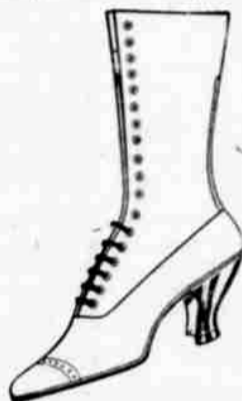
CORVALLIS, Jan. 7.—(Special to the Democrat)—It is very difficult to secure at this time, says Prof. C. I. Lewis of O. A. C., a supply of Italian prunes; consequently, nurserymen, especially outside the state of Oregon, will try to induce people interested in prune growing to plant other varieties.

The Petite French or French prune has met with some favor in the Northwest. This does especially well in certain sections of the Umpqua Valley and has many advantages, since it tends to bear very regularly and heavily. The disadvantage of this prune is its small size. There is, however, a splendid market for the petite and size to size, it is apt to bring a little more money than the Italian. Evidently there are at least two strains of petite. One is a small, slim prune, and the other is a larger, more oval type. Growers should strive to secure the latter if possible.

Of these two prunes which are being established outside of the state, the first one is known as the Roeb de Sargeant and the second as the Roph de Sargeant. The first prune is known in the horticultural world as the Agen. It is supposed to be synonymous to the petite or French prune. The second prune is the Roeb de Sargeant and is sometimes known as the Sargeant. This latter prune we have been testing in our trial grounds, and it fruited for the first time last year. If it is true to name it is a prune of questionable value. While we are able to try it, we would not care to advocate its planting until we have been able to give it further trial.

Now it is very probable that these two prunes, namely, the Roeb de Sargeant and the Roph de Sargeant, have become mixed and in buying either one there is a possibility that our prune growers will be buying something different than they expect.

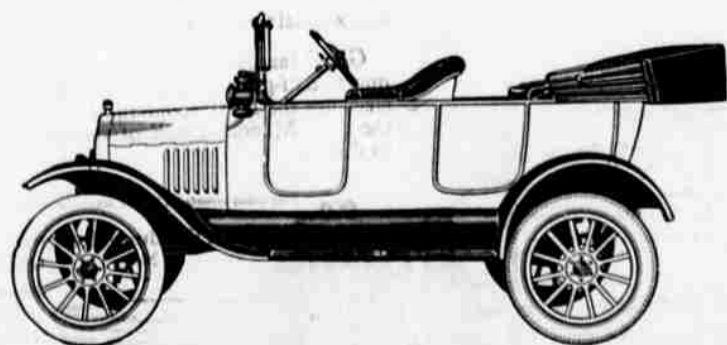
## MEN WANTED
