**A WORD WITH YOU, GERMAN FRIEND**

Suppose the Kaiser wins in Europe. Concede for the moment that he would have been content with that before we entered the war. Wouldn't he be rather foolish to quit at that point since we are in the war now? We are in the war, whether rightly or wrongly; and Germany, if victorious, will just as certainly cross the Atlantic to recoup her losses at our expense as she appropriated Alsace and Lorraine for the same purpose.

And when the German army comes, where will you be? Do you suppose that army will pause to ask whether or not you are of German blood? And for the matter of that, why should it? Didn't you come here in the first place largely to escape military duty in the old country? Did you fly to her aid on the outbreak of hostilities three years ago by enlistment or otherwise? No, you stayed right here in a safe place, placidly laying up money as usual. You yelled yourself hoarse for the Fatherland, but you did not shoulder a gun for that Fatherland, or send your son in your place. So why should Germany pause in her revenge on America to take a census of those who so "loyally" espoused her cause with the cheapest gift at their command—talk?

No, your house will be burned, your money taken, your body bayoneted and your daughter ravished as quickly and as thoroughly as those tragedies will be heaped upon any Yankee of us all. And if we are thrashed in the process you will be taxed by the United States government along with the rest of us to pay billions of indemnity into Germany's coffers. You may be kicking about taxes now, but the amount the government asks today or will ask in the future, is a mere bagatelle compared to the assessments of a future spent with the German yoke upon our necks.

Use a little common sense, Herr German; apply that boasted mental power of your race and figure out what will happen to you if Germany wins. Then get busy and do your part to keep her forever from our shores.—Cedar Rapids Republican.

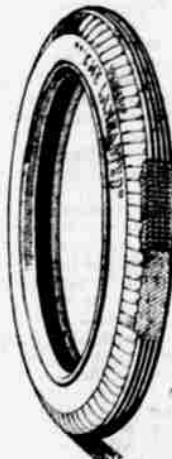
