**THE CONQUERING TRUCK**

The postoffice department is planning to extend its motor truck parcel service within the next three months, to new routes totalling about 4,000 miles. There is to be one chain of department trucks extending all the way from Portland, Me., to New Orleans. Another chain will cover a large stretch of territory in Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and West Virginia. Another will serve California cities. Routes are already in operation connecting Washington with various cities in Maryland and Pennsylvania.

It is expected that eventually the whole country will be covered by a network of postal truck routes, greatly relieving the railroads and in many cases giving more prompt and dependable service than can be obtained from the railroads in normal times. Every such extension aids materially in the distribution of parcel post matter, and tends to lower the cost.

Meanwhile the commercial conquests of the motor truck continue. One of the latest developments is the announcement of a \$1,500,000 corporation announced in Toledo, O., to provide truck freight service between Chicago and Cleveland and between Detroit and Cincinnati. A fleet of 100 large trucks will be in operation within 30 days. The routes allow 12 hours for the trip from Cleveland to Toledo and 24 hours from Toledo to Chicago. The time allowance from Detroit to Cincinnati is 23 hours. In the heyday of American railroading freight was never transported so rapidly as this.

gate was in the grain business in Albany. He has added considerable speed to his bowling.

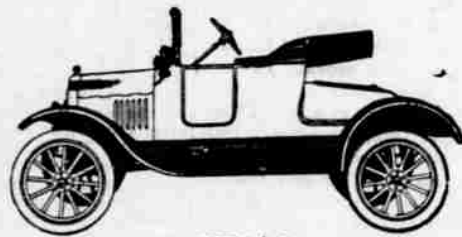

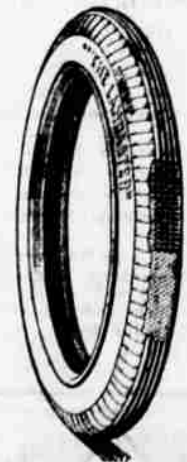
