

Even American readers might look upon many of the pres ident's war views as "illogical and unheard of if they were printed only in the form of short extracts, outside of their natural setting, without the accompanying facts and comment that render them logical and convincing.

The "mutilization" referred to by the papers mentioned, was done it this case by the helpful hand of the German govovernment. In so vita a matter, it doesn't do to let the biggest editors in Germany use their own slavish discretion.

So it happens once more that the only way to get into Germany a state ment of incalculable value to the Ger man nation is to smuggle it acros the trenches or drop it over the bor der from airplanes. That is being done. But it is a slow process. And because of its slowness, it is still ne cessary to continue the crude and distasteful alternative of shooting truth into Germany from gun muzzles.


