One of the wholesome effects incidental to the five days' suspension of industrial activity east of the Mississippi is that it has brought home to the country, as nothing had done previously, the fact that the United States is engaged in a big, hard war. We have all known this, in a way. But most of us have had a sort of idea that we could proceed with everything about as usual, that the war was something apart from us which would go on of its own accord in a mechanical way to an ultimate victory.

The war will not go on of its own accord. Everybody has got to jump in and help. Everybody has got to recognize the facts. Everybody has got to work and save and feel and suffer. And the more keenly we feel the situation now, the more clearly we see the facts now, the harder we work now, the more frugally we live now, the more we suffer now—the less we shall have to pay later, and the smaller will be the total toll.

We did not want this practical moral lesson administered. We do not like it. But if it makes us all realize what the nation is up against in the economic side of war-making, and realize a little of what our allies have long been enduring, it will be very good for us. And this moral benefit is in addition to the practical advantages promised.

TOYS MADE IN GERMANY Last Christmas was not an affair of the genial Santa Claus with German children. Not even this day was sacred from the war God. Many of the toys given German youngsters have fallen into the hands of the allies. Most of them are models of cities destroyed by German arms, showing the heaps of mortar, brick and stone which in many cases are all that is left of Northern French and Belgian cities.

There are also picture books for the recreation and education of the German youth. These are filled with illustrations of military maneuvers in which the German troops are always victorious, their enemies always destroyed. It's the same old trick in a new form—the attempt to bring up a generation hating all non-Germans, exalting militarism.

How long, oh people of the great, peace-loving democracies—how long?

THE WELL-MEANING TURK The full thoughtfulness and consideration of the Turks in wishing to control Palestine have perhaps not been fully understood. They are made clear by the statement of a Turkish Grand Vizier. It is reported that this worthy gentleman has put it thus: "The sovereignty of a neutral power of another faith is most desirable from a Christian standpoint, as friction among Christian sects would otherwise lead to the greatest inconveniences." Apparently the Grand Vizier believes that Syrians and Armenians, the leading "Christian sects" of Palestine, would cast a unanimous vote for Turkish rule to save them from such inconvenient friction.

Judged by past demonstrations of the Turkish method of preventing this friction and avoiding the inconveniences referred to, however, the thoughtful observer is likely to set the Vizier down as mistaken in his opinions. Almost as mistaken as the Prussian militarists are in most of their views concerning other peoples.

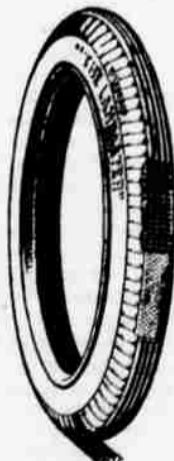
