OLD FRUIT TREES TO BE REJUVENATED

The immediate rejuvenation of the hundreds of millions of more or less barren fruit trees throughout the United States, so as to bring them up to their full productivity, is the object of a new movement which has been started by the food administrator of Iowa, working with the nurserymen and agricultural agents of that state, and which is being energetically taken up by other food administrators all over the country.

"This is a splendid and very practical idea," said W. K. Newell, assistant federal food administrator for Oregon, "and one that we expect to follow up in this state. We all recognize that fruit is a necessary food and extremely valuable in the maintenance of general good health. While Oregon is especially prolific in fruits of high quality and great variety, there are many orchards that are being neglected and have not been bearing up to their full quality or quantity for a number of seasons. Owners of such orchards should immediately get in touch with this office or with the Oregon Agricultural college at Corvallis for advice as to how to rejuvenate their trees and get them into full bearing as soon as possible. The aggregate amount of the fruit that neglected trees in this state may be made to yield, will be a very substantial addition to Oregon's food resources. Full production of every kind of food is urgently asked by Mr. Hoover, in order that we may feed our armies and the allies, and fruit is a very important item. The rejuvenation of old or neglected fruit trees is merely efficiency, and we must have more efficiency if we are to win this war against the most efficient nation in the world."

MORE PRUSSIAN THOROUGHNESS

One interesting little detail of the German occupation of Poland and the Baltic provinces of Russia has just come to light. It develops that Germany has been finching her hold on this big, valuable territory with economic as well as military weapons. Her chief piece of economic strategy seems to have been the Germanizing of the whole transportation system.


