ANSWER FILED IN FUNK NEIR SUIT

Weatherford & Wyatt, attorneys for defendants in the suit of Louis Funk and other heirs of the late Christian Funk, against Matilda Gordon, and others, today filed answers of the defendants Matilda Gordon, Tom Lowell and Ralph Kern.

Mrs. Gordon, second wife of Christian Funk, who has remarried, states in her answer that before her marriage with Funk, in consideration of giving up her home in Omaha, Neb., and moving to Oregon, she entered into an agreement with him on Sept. 13, 1904, mutually agreeing that in consideration of said marriage Funk was to turn over all his property upon his death to his wife. He was to have control during his life. The property was transferred to Ralph Kern to hold in trust, consisting of 210 acres in Nebraska and 927 acres in Oregon, as well as all personal property.

After the death of Funk on Nov. 18, 1907, the property was turned over to Mrs. Gordon by Ralph Kern and wife.

The defendants allege that plaintiffs should be barred from action on account of over ten years having elapsed and much evidence lost. Other defenses are set up in the answer.
