AMERICAN BOLSHEVIKI

Just as we've been congratulating ourselves on the disappearance of our I. W. W., we see their Russian counterpart, the Bolsheviki, struggling for a foothold in America.

The first American branch of that notorious cult is said to have been organized a few days ago in New York City. The place for its introduction occasions no surprise. We'd expect Bolshevism to break out in the metropolis, if anywhere.

It doesn't seem likely, from present indications, that the movement will get very far. It may rally to its red banner some odds and ends of immigrant malcontents not yet assimilated, a few naturalized citizens and alien residents of the sort that are always giving us political indignation.

The leaders profess their faith that in the spirit and plan of Bolshevism lies the only hope of preventing future wars. It's quite possible that if everybody turned Bolshevik, there wouldn't be any more war. But whether it's worth while to purchase peace at the price of political anarchy and economic paralysis is another question.

Sure, it's better to have our industries entirely shut down for a few days than to have them running at half capacity all winter.

AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOLS

It is reported that for the remainder of the winter Wisconsin high schools will be turned into agricultural schools. Ten thousand Wisconsin high school boys who have never been farmers will be taught the rudiments of farming and gardening and will be turned out in April to help fight the Germans by producing food in their state.

To do this, the assistant state superintendent of education of Wisconsin explains, the whole public school system had to be adapted to the needs of the state and of the country. In the first place, there had to be a speeding up of the regular high school work. The students were not robbed of opportunity to complete their normal high school training. But along with that a laboratory course in agriculture was introduced. Active and retired farmers of the state formed a big brothers organization. Its members volunteered to take boys into their homes for week-ends and to teach them elementary farming. An educational campaign is being conducted among farmers throughout the state to make them willing to utilize boy labor for the things that the growing boy is able to do about the farm and to give him an opportunity for learning more about agriculture. The rural schools are conducting a survey to show the labor and seed-grain needs of the state.

In short, they're all getting busy to provide additional help for the farmers next spring and summer, to get as large a force as possible of boys and young men to do what gardening and farming they are able to do in the best possible way. More power to the agriculturally-inclined high schools!
