SUPPORT THE PRESIDENT

President Wilson asks congress for
greater power in order to prosecute
the war successfully against the Cen-
tral Powers. It should be granted
and granted without undue delay.

to listen patiently to a partisan con-

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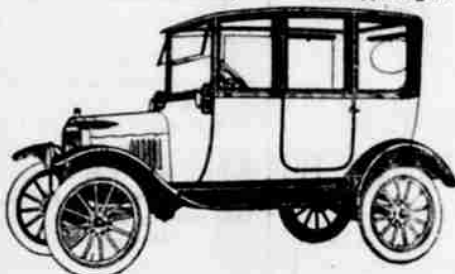

Bean.

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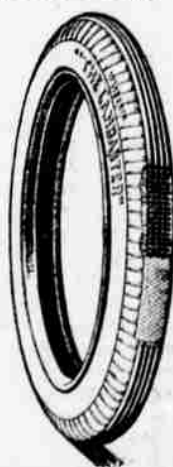
