KNOX BUTTE CHURCH
DEDICATES SERVICE FLAG

KNOX BUTTE, Feb. 14.—(Special to the Democrat)—A service flag was dedicated at the Central Christian church Sunday morning. Eight young men in this vicinity were honored in an impressive service when the flags containing eight stars representing the young men who have enlisted in the service of the country, was dedicated; seven being now in service and one having died. The committee assisting with the presentation of the flag was Mrs. Riley Frazier, Mrs. Clyde Frazier and Mrs. Geo. Wasson. J. Landers, superintendent of the Central Sunday school, delivered the dedicatory address; and the exercises were concluded with the congregation singing "The Star Spangled Banner" and prayer by the superintendent.

Following are the eight young men honored: Gilbert Parsons, deceased, who, at the time of his death was a member of the U. S. regulars at Fort McDowell, Calif. Those now in service—Lester Powell, aviation corps, U. S. A., Texas; Ferris Williams, Viron Cade, Leslie Endicott, Warren Parsons, Harvey McNabe, all of 5th Co., C. A. C., Fort Canby; Manly Copeland, U. S. marines, Guam Island naval training station.

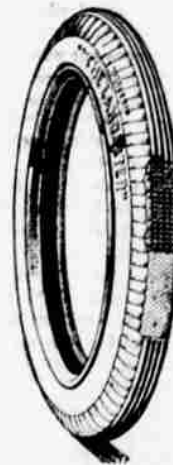
