PARTISANSHIP UBER ALLES

Attacks on the conduct of the war are announced by Penrose as the plan for his party in the congressional campaign.

That is the way Hindenburg will best like it. Ludendorff will be pleased with it too. And so will the Kaiser.

Nothing so heartens the junkers attacking us on the west front as attacks on the conduct of the war in America. Help from the rear while you attack in front is a wonderful plan of military campaign.

The Prussian war lords are searching constantly for something with which to hearten the drooping German people. The problem is to keep them in the trenches and at work in the coal mines and munition plants. We know this from the late industrial.

The German people were long told that America couldn't fight. They have been fed on that propaganda, but with half a million Americans on the Lorraine front and more pouring into France, the German masses are beginning to have a dread. They have a sickening fear that they may have been deceived about the Americans. On that account they are said, in the dispatches, to have given up hopes of a victorious peace. But Penrose is going to reassure them. His attacks on the conduct of the war are the stuff to again persuade them that America can't fight. Penrose's speeches will be the best propaganda the Kaiser can find for circulating in Germany to stiffen up the hopes of the drooping German masses.

They will also be a wonderful aid to the Kaiser in holding Austria in line. The Austrian masses are weary of war. They are learning that they are being used for evil purposes by the Prussian junkers. President Wilson's great effort is to split these Austro-Hungarians off from junkerdom, and great headway is being made.

But the president's hand is to be pulled down. He is to be attacked at home in a campaign of months for his conduct of the war. The confidence of the Austrian masses in him as spokesman of liberty and emancipation for the submerged, is to be weakened. They are to be told by Penrose that the American president is not competent to conduct a war, that he is distrusted by the American people, that his words are not worth listening to by the Austrian people.

It will all be wonderful aid to the junkers and the Kaiser. It will help them hold the Austrians in line longer, and help them stimulate Germans to fight the American soldiers harder. It will help lengthen the roll of the American dead. It will help extend the period of the war. It will help swell the total of the Liberty Loan demands and the Red Cross demands and the other war demands.—Portland Journal.

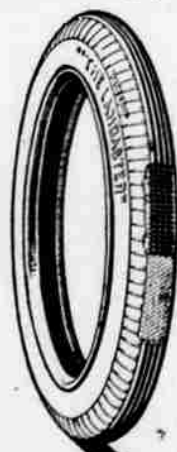
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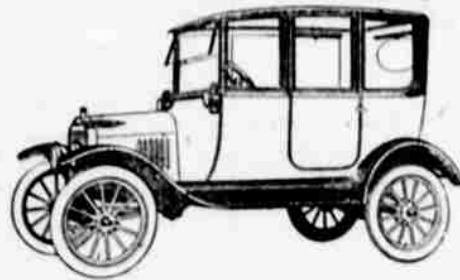
