PRICES SET FOR OTHER FRUITS BY ASSOCIATION

Before leaving for Puyallup Wednesday morning Mr. W.H. Paulhaus, general manager of the Linn and Benton County Fruit association, stated that aside from the regular contract prices on certain fruits, other varieties will also be taken at good prices. The association offers four and one-fourth cents per pound for Wilson strawberries; four and one-half for Monger raspberries; phenomenal berries, three and one-half cents, and loganberries, three and one-half cents. In addition, the association will pay four cents per pound for Royal Anne cherries; one and one-fourth cents for Damson plums; one cent for Italian prunes, and other varieties of strawberries other than specified, four cents per pound. While no prices have been set, the association will also buy gooseberries, red and black currants, peaches, grapes and Bartlett pears. It is the intention of the association to make a market for everything produced on the farm and to secure for

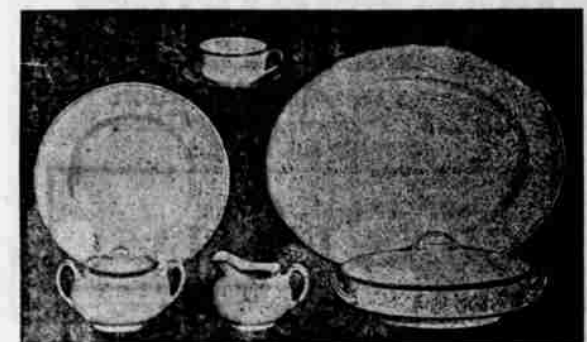
