BENEVOLENT PRUSSIA

In the recent German-Russian peace conference at Brest-Litovsk the German foreign secretary, von Kuehlmann, drew a delightful picture of Teutonic benevolence with regard to Russia. Germany, he insisted, was a peace loving, non-aggressive nation, of whose designs Russia need have no fear whatever.

"I need only refer to Mr. Trotsky," he said, "to the permanent basis of the German policy, which up to the time when the war with Russia was forced on the German people, consisted in the preservation of good and friendly relations with our eastern neighbors. Germany's policy will always continue to strive for the friendliest relations with newly organized Russia by avoiding all interference in its internal affairs."

Good old honest, modest, non-meditating Prussia! Who, indeed, but a malicious enemy could imagine her interfering in Russia's internal affairs, or grabbing any of Russia's territory, or trying to impose her will on any of the races inhabiting the old Russian Empire? All German activities in Russia hereafter, as in the past, will be wholly unselfish.

And yet, some of those benighted Russians persist in misunderstanding Germany! Was there ever such a hideous distrust since Little Red Riding Hood began to suspect the intentions of the benevolent wolf?

That Austrian eagle-bird will be lucky if he makes peace before he gets one of his heads shot off.

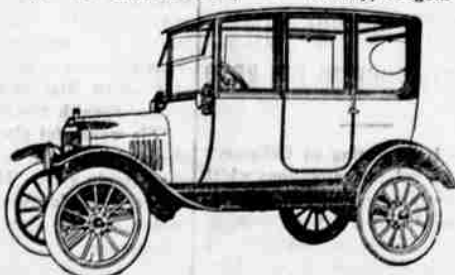

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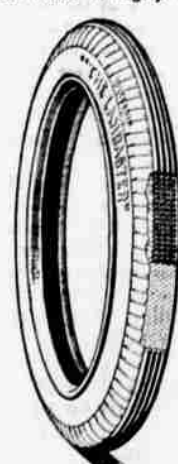
