OREGON BREEDER BUYS

ABERDEEN-ANGUS CATTLE

CHICAGO, Feb. 26.—(Special to the Democrat)—Oregon is to receive a shipment of 30 head of the best purebred Aberdeen-Angus breeding cattle to be found in the Middle West, it was learned at the office of Secretary Charles Gray of the American Aberdeen-Angus Breeders' association today. Casper Koehler, pioneer ranchman operating in the John Day river territory in Grant

county, bought the 20 bulls and ten heifers from Porteous & Sutton, of Lawrence, Kansas. Mr. Koehler insists that the Aberdeen-Angus are the best breed for Oregon, and that their winnings at the International convinced him years ago that for beef making, both in the grain belt and on the range, they were the best breed supreme. At the last international show Aberdeen-Angus steers won all three carlot Grand Championships—fat steers, short-feds and feeders.
