Governor Brough of Arkansas, in
a Chicago speech submitted this
acrostic:

"K" stands for killing.
"U" stands for U-boat.
"L" stands for leis.
"T" stands for treachery.
"U" stands for unfaithfulness.
"R" stands for ruthlessness.

That's pretty rough on Germans,
when you come to think it over. If,
along in the spring of the year 1914
or at any previous time, anybody had
ventured to say that the vaunted sys-
tem of life known as German Kultur
or Culture was a compound of
slaughter, falsehood, treachery and
brutality, he would have been set
down as a fit subject for a lunatic
asylum. And now three-fourths of
the world acquiesces in this drastic
summary of the character and ideals
of the German nation—because it is
a natural and logical inference from
the conduct of Germany during the
last four years.

We cannot believe yet that these
are natural characteristics of the Ger-
man people, or of any people. They
are so essentially suicidal that no
social or political order, no durable
system of ordered life, can ever be
founded upon them. We still be-
lieve that they are the fruit of per-
nicious ideals deliberately taught and
imposed upon the German nation by
a small criminal class possessed of
accidental power and prestige. But
as month after month goes by, and
Germany plunges ever deeper into
excesses of barbarism, it becomes
harder to persuade open minded people
that the Germany of this bestial
war is not the real Germany,
or that we can reasonably expect any-
thing else from the German nation
hereafter.

If the German people themselves
could only see this—if they could
only appreciate the depth of degra-
dation into which the German name
has been driven by the diplomatic and
military crimes perpetrated in the
name of their Fatherland—surely they
would rise, even now, and sweep their
criminal masters from power, and

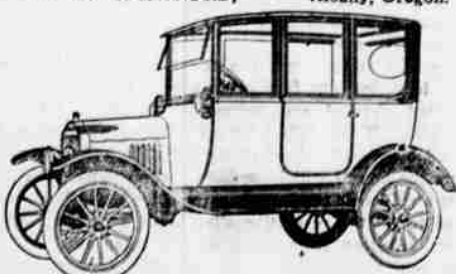

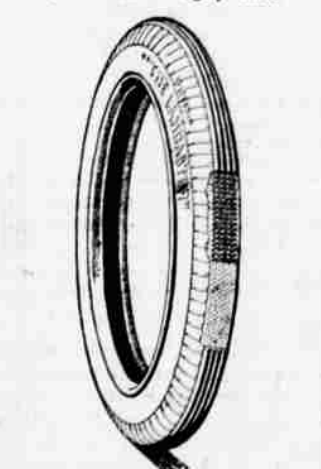
