CASHING PEACE CHECKS

"Go to von Hindenburg with them," Lloyd George told the British laborites when they wanted to submit their admirable peace terms to Germany. "Try to cash that check in the Hindenburg bank. It will be returned dishonored. Whatever terms are set forth by any pacifist orator in these lands, you will not get them cashed by Ludendorff, or the Kaiser, or any of those military magnates—not one of them unless you have the power to enforce them."

But the British workmen insisted on submitting the terms to the German working people. Surely, they said, such a check written by the British labor party would be cashed by such men as Scheidemann and Liebnicht.

"Herr Liebnicht," replied the premier, "is in jail. That is what happened to his attempt to cash peace checks in Germany. Herr Scheidemann will find himself in the same place if he attempts a similar operation."

We have had striking corroboration of this view in the German-Russian negotiations. The peace check offered by the representatives of the Russian workmen called for incomparably less than that of the British workmen. It was torn up and the pieces thrown in their faces; and Germany herself proceeded to present some checks of her own—enormous in amount, too—and collect them by force.

It is only thus that Germany can be brought to recognize any set of honest and tolerable peace terms. They must be presented on the point of a bayonet, and backed by resistless power.

FOREIGN TRADE OF U. S. IN JANUARY

January imports were valued at \$235,000,000, an increase of \$7,000,000 over December but, exports showed a falling off of eighty million dollars from the very high figure of \$584,000,000 recorded for December.

According to a statement issued Feb. 25 by the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, Department of Commerce, the imports for the seven months of the fiscal year ended with January were valued at \$1,634,000,000 as against \$1,348,000,000 for the corresponding period for the previous year. Exports for the seven month period totaled \$3,448,000,000 as compared with \$3,616,000,000 for a similar period the year previous.

Gold imports in January were \$4,404,000 and for the seven month period \$78,694,000. Exports were valued at \$3,746,000 in January and at \$41,186,000 for the seven months ended with that month.

The imports of silver in January totaled \$5,997,455 and for the seven months, \$41,186,000. Exports in January were valued at \$6,628,000 and for the seven months ended with January, \$52,032,000.
